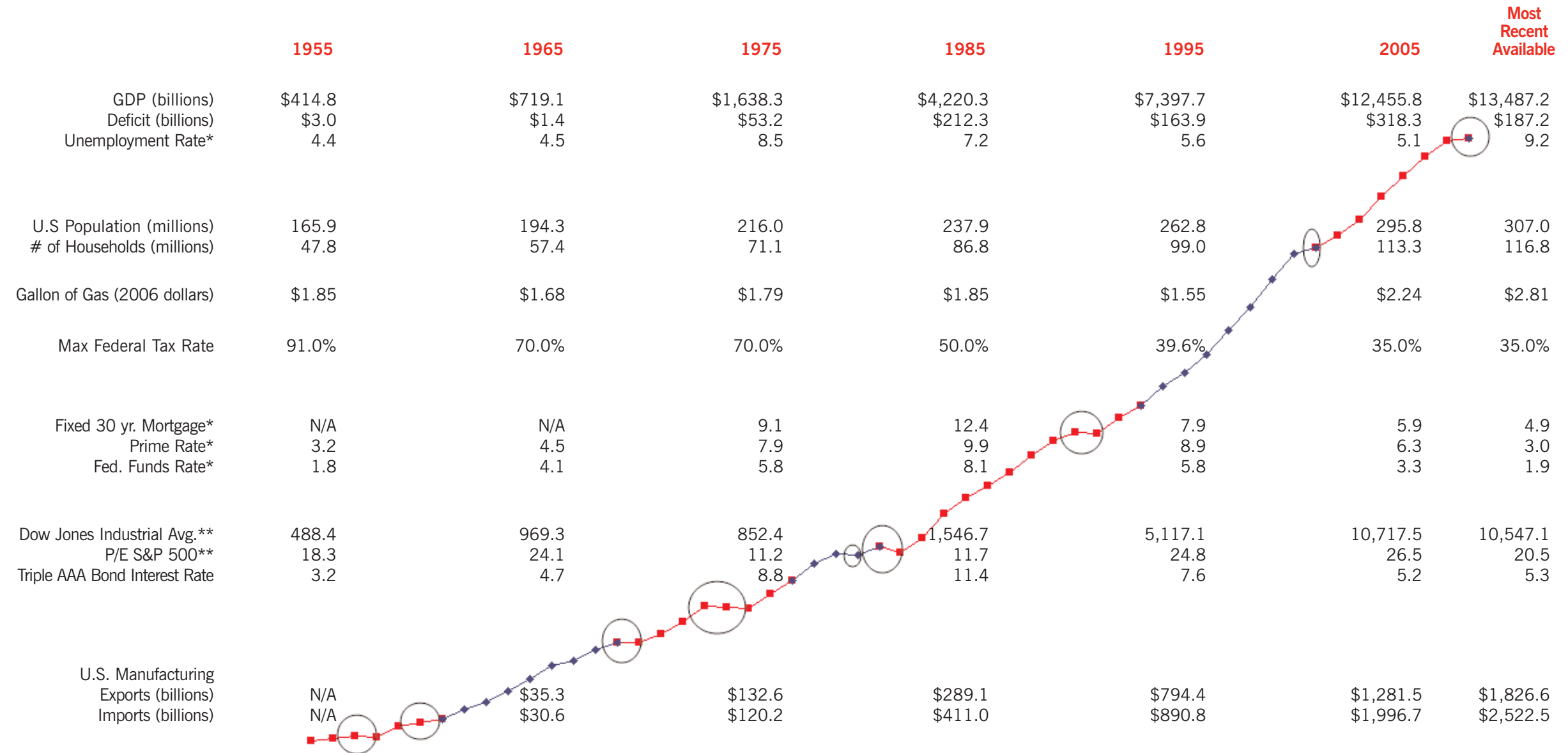


# Statistical Art: Economic Indicators vs. Political Parties
